Sharing of Best Practices Questions to foment BPAG Sharing

Questions:

- What specific assessment methods are used to evaluate program effectiveness and student learning? How effective are these assessment methods?
- What examples of effective assessment tools, instruments, techniques or analysis can be shared and considered a best practice applicable across academic program assessment? How has the APAIR impacted your program's planning and assessment practices?
- What data is collected to measure program effectiveness, and student learning outcomes? How effective are these performance indicators in predicting student achievement?
- How is the collected assessment data analyzed and interpreted?
- How / does peer-institutional data impact your assessment practices?
- What strategies are employed to involve faculty and staff in the assessment process?
- What challenges have been encountered in assessment practices, and how have they been addressed?
- How are assessment results used to inform and improve programs and teaching methods?
- What examples demonstrate how assessment practices have led to tangible improvements in student learning or program
 effectiveness?
- What resources or support have been crucial in developing and maintaining assessment practices? What are some tools needed to enhance your assessment facility?
- How are assessment results and improvements communicated to stakeholders, including students, faculty, and administrators?
